<p>What provisions has the camp made (or can it make) for children with motor coordination challenges, crutches, or wheelchairs?</p>	<p>Our camp facility is completely wheelchair accessible, with paved paths all throughout camp and ramps on each cabin. There is also a ramp entry into the pool, as well as a lift to lower individuals down into the water. We encourage portable Hoyer lifts to be brought to camp to allow for easier transfers as needed. We provide shower chairs and changing tables. Staff are trained in safe transfers and all daily living care.</p>
<p>Can the camp provide appropriate meals for children with special diets? If not, can parents send food for their child?</p>	<p>Our cook has been with Camp Greentop for roughly 14 years and has much experience with special diets. We are able to accommodate limited diets such as no dairy, or no peanuts. If it is a more detailed diet (no gluten or casein), we ask that parents bring enough already prepared food to last the entire stay. We are not able to accommodate campers with airborne allergies as we can not guarantee that our camp will be free of that item.</p>

<p>What type of certification do the counselors have?</p>	<p>Any staff working in a high-risk area have a certification based on that activity (i.e. lifeguarding, archery instructor, etc.) All staff are current in CPR and First Aid. Leadership team are also certified in Medication Administration. All staff also go through a 10-day orientation in which they receive training on a variety of topics, including but not limited to Activities of Daily Living, Characteristics of Disabilities, Seizures, Bloodborne Pathogens, Programming for persons with disabilities, etc.</p>

What kind of medical staff is available in the infirmary and during what hours?	<p>At least one nurse is on-site at all times. During peak medication times, we typically have two nurses. We also have a Health Center Assistant who is trained in CPR, First Aid, and Medication Administration. Health Center staff live on site and are available 24/7 while camp is in session. We also have a local physician on-call. Because we are in a National Park, Park Rangers are the first responders, and they have a higher level of CPR/First Aid Training, and an ambulance is only about 10 minutes away. There are two hospitals within 20 minutes away from Camp.</p>
Can the staff administer medications?	Yes
Is the camp staff trained to handle behavioral problems?	<p>Yes. We provide a training during orientation which goes over various behaviors that may be seen at camp, as well as common redirective techniques. The 2:1 camper to counselor ratio allows staff to be available in the event of a behavior. For those participants who have a complex behavior plan or who tend to wander from the group often, we provide a 1:1 ratio at an additional fee.</p> <p>We also teach all of our staff Behavioral Principles and Strategies (BPS). This includes recognizing signs of agitation and techniques to de-escalate. It also includes techniques for blocking or releasing holds. Our leadership team is trained in basket holds, which is always used as a last resort.</p>

<p>Is there anything else you would like caregivers to know about your camp?</p>	<p>The summer of 2012 will be Camp Greentop's 75th anniversary. We have built up a reputation of providing quality summer camp programs for both youth and adults with a variety of needs.</p> <p>In addition to our traditional overnight camp and day camp, we also provide a primitive tent camping program as well as a travel camp program.</p> <p>Youth (ages 7-21) sessions are quite structured and provide very little down time during the day. Adult (ages 18+) sessions are more relaxed and offer day trips to various community locations in addition to all on-site programming.</p>

We have an on-site chef who is able to prepare anything we need. Also, parents can send food for the children which we hold in a designated place.</p>

Is there anything else you would like caregivers to know about your camp?	<p>In addition to traditional camp activities, the campers attend support/psychotherapy groups to discuss issues common to all young people and those specific to children with chronic health conditions. They also attend seminars given by the medical staff to learn about their conditions and are encouraged to ask any and all questions they have been afraid to ask in the past.</p> <p>We offer a Transitional Youth Program for young adults in need of additional help in becoming more independent in their lives. It is a structured program, tailored to the needs of the participants and provides them with a support network of peers.</p> <p>Our leadership training program is for those youngsters who want to take on more responsibilities and become counselors-in-training. They are assigned to work with an experienced counselor and meet with the camp director and assistant director nightly for supervision and support. CITs are eligible to become junior counselors at age 18.</p>
